16. Highlights of the month

- The "ODOP" project has carried out Micro Enterprise Survey(among the savings groups) and Market survey, total 22 villages covered conducting 34 Focus Group Discussion and five enterprises selected as per priority basis for the selection of final product in respect of ODOP model product. There are 110 individual interview has been taken among the Wholesalers and Retailers from the 14 village and urban market randomly to finalize the ODOP product pondering the market demand. After conducting the deeper analysis the survey report has been revealed that the model ODOP product would be first Dairy Product, Second Fresh Fruits and Vegetables and third one is Handicraft (Embroidery). Hence during this month the model product was finalized.
- Formation of 143 new microenterprises (113 female and 30 male) and expansion of 67 existing microenterprises (44 female and 23 male) in the three districts (Sholgara, Kaldar and Marmul) of Balkh province which has resulted in creation of 282 jobs for (214 female and 68 male) community members.
- Sum of AFN **274,700** recollected as repayments of EIF loan from group members during the month of August 2014 which reflects a repayment rate of 107%.
- Sum of AFN 858,580 saved within the groups by members in the districts of Balkh, Samangan and Jawzjan provinces.
- 64 internal loans took place among the group members with a total value of AFN **438,500**.



- 109 group members trained on different vocational skills such as; poultry, agriculture, horticulture, kitchen gardening, tailoring and decoration.
- 90 micro-entrepreneurs (59 female and 31 male) have been benefitted from business consultancy on poultry, horticulture, beekeeping, tailoring and livestock in Sholgara, Kalda and Marmul of Balkh province and received technical quality improvement and marketing support to expand their business.
- Exposure visit: Four groups had exchange visits into poultry enterprises of one another in Balkh province and shared their learnings, motivations and experiences.
- Hand in Hand Afghanistan distributed 127 enterprise start-up toolkits to eligible members under SLP2. The toolkits are given to members who have completed a vocational skills training and have a business plan to setup a new enterprise or expand the existing enterprises. The toolkits are livestock, poultery, tailoring, kitchen garden, beekeeping, fishery, wool spinning and etc. for the specific skills.
- Hand in Hand Afghanistan started 16 life skills training classes for 430 illiterate women entrepreneurs in Balkh province. Classes are well equipped with the literacy books, stationeries and class materials.











- 16 representatives from 10 SMEs, 8 representatives from 5 SMEs in Panjab and similarly 8 representatives from 5 SMEs in Yakawlang district were trained on bookkeeping; accounting, operation & supply chain management, business management, marketing management & promotion, legal and social challenges in Bamyan province.

A case study:

Khawanin is a livestock rearing entrepreneur and a member of Quds SHG in Zawarha village of Sholgara district since February 2013 and has saved sum of AFN 2,250 within the group. He received livestock vocational training and has learned a lot such as; proper feeding method, corral hygiene and vaccines which helped him a lot to improve his business. He has also learned different types of animal diseases and ways to prevent them.

He rears and fattens small sheep and sells in to Sholgara and Mazar city market. Khawanin usually earned AFN 10,000 before because he



was selling to brokers that had kept him away from the market, but his income has increased to AFN 18,000 per month after he put his learnings into practice. The new improved skill helped him increase his income and make a better living for his family. "I could rebuild new windows and doors for our cottage and I am happy" Khawanin said.
