

# Hand in Hand Afghanistan October Flash Report

#### 2. Highlights of the month

- Formation of 252 new microenterprises (164 female and 88 male) and expansion of 134 existing ones (71 female and 63 male) in Balkh province under SLP2 project which has resulted in creation of 540 jobs for (329 female and 211 male) community members.
- Sum of AFN **477,450** recollected as repayments of EIF loan from groups during the month of October 2014 which reflects a repayment rate of **115%**.
- Sum of AFN **986,482** saved within the groups by members in Marmul, Sholgara, Kaldar districts of Balkh Province, Dara-e-Suf Bala, Dara-e-Suf Payan districts of Samangan province and Aqcha district of Jawzjan Province.
- 49 internal loans took place among the group members with a total value of AFN 460,150 in Marmul, Sholgara, Kaldar districts of Balkh Province and Aqcha district of Jawzjan Province. Internal loans aim to utilize the group savings accumulated by members for creation and expansion of enterprises.
- 205 group members (70 female & 135 male) have been trained on different vocational skills such as Poultry, Agriculture, Kitchen Gardening, Livestock, Horticulture, Tailoring and Decoration in Marmul, Sholgara and Kaldar districts of Balkh province under SLP2.
- 234 micro-entrepreneurs (218 female and 16 male) have been benefitted from business consultancy on Agriculture, Tailoring, Wool spinning and Poultry, and consulted on the quality improvement and marketing, in Marmul, Shadian and Sholgara district of Balkh province.



- Hand in Hand Afghanistan has distributed 246 enterprise start-up toolkits to eligible members under SLP2 project in Balkh province. The toolkits are given to members who have completed vocational skills training and have a business plan to setup a new enterprise or expand the existing ones. Availing the necessary tools for different types of enterprises such as agriculture, kitchen gardening, livestock, tailoring, fish farm and wool spinning have been supportive for established better income.
- Two entrepreneurs from Aadel SHG on poultry enterprises were linked to Mazar-e-Sharif market and they have already sold 800 kg of chicken within two months to the market.
- 12 Village Enterprise Facilitators (9 female and 3 male) have received ToT on Life Skills training, they started 12 classes for 283 illiterate women entrepreneurs in Jawzjan province.
- Two stakeholder meetings conducted in Dara-e-Sufa Bala in order to orient the next step of project which is literacy/life skills training for entrepreneurs, vocational training and motivate them to have active participation and cooperation during project implementation.

- Under the SME training project in Bamyan province, on-site training session conducted for 17 SMEs, trainers paid mentoring visits to every SME and supported all the SME members to benefit from the training modules and practice what they have learned at the classroom sessions.
- A four-day ToT conducted for the Enterprise Development Experts focused on "Rural Entrepreneurs Capacity Enhancement Coaching for virtual effect on Business Development" covering the entire five training modules, under OPOP project in Herat and Parwan provinces. And 164 Entrepreneurs (64 female and 99 male) have been trained on Enterprise Group Management for all the four sectors; Fresh Fruit, Vegetable, Dairy and Embroidery groups.

#### 3. A case study:

Bibi Gul is one among the hundred women who has benefited from support of HiH program in Balkh province. Bibi Gul joined Marmar SHG two years before in Maherjer village of Sholgara district. She is married, has four children and her husband is a labour with very less daily wage. Bibi Gul is a disabled woman and uses a rod while walking. She has got trainings on microfinance, BDS and used internal loans to buy a sewing machine and paid the loan back to the group saving within six months. At the beginning she had just earned monthly sum of AFN 2,000, while now her income increased to sum of AFN 4,500 in a month. By increasing her income, she pays home expenses and buys her children school materials. She is planning to expand her business with starting embroidery and knitting in the future and create jobs for other interesting women in the village. *'Disable people also have the talent to work*'' says Bibi Gul. Her life has changed; many people know her and respect her now. She is happy with the positive changes in her life and thankful to Hand in Hand's efforts in supporting her.
